Report from Kirke Harper on current status of Talbot County's revising the Comprehensive Plan:

The Council held 10 workshops to review the draft plan submitted to them by the Planning Commission last winter. These meetings took up the spring, summer and fall and consisted primarily in Council members talking with each other and the Planning staff. During the process Staff collected new language and ideas and produced one or more matrices [that listed the suggested language or idea for change, staff's response or suggested new language]. Council held "straw votes" to quide the staff.

In late November staff then prepared a new "red line" draft plan [with all of the "Straw vote" approved changes in red]. Council then held an open meeting on December 7 with a 15 person citizen panel (I was on that panel). Next was an open meeting on December 14 with public testimony.

Following the two open meetings Staff prepared another matrix showing comments and suggested changes.

Then on Dec 29 Council held an open meeting with the Planning Commission and the Public Works Advisory Board. The Council had planned to vote on the new matrix at that meeting, but a decision was announced to send the matrix and plan back to the PC. That was a crucial decision.




