The movie series launched in January 2013 and except for 2021 and 2022 has become a highly anticipated winter event.




We have many great items already donated so please plan to attend and maybe you will find the perfect item for yourself.

Paul Morehead was a celebrated pioneering geneticist, a civil rights activist, an amateur astronomer, and an avid tennis player.

Paul and his wife, Becky Otter, moved to their house on Miracle House Circle in 1991, and left us for Londonderry 27 years later. Community builders from the beginning, they hosted the first Claiborne-wide social gathering, an ice cream sundae party, in their back yard.

There was another, more mysterious, establishment at the ferry wharf, across from The Sea Gull Inn. I suspect it was a restaurant started by Albert and Mary Wyatt and was at one point named "The Al-Mar Inn." Margaret Bryan, who lived in Claiborne at the time, was warned by her father (B.F. Sherman) not to approach this establishment, which she describes as "a rough place."

Detailed information on this place is hard to come by, but it may be (not yet certain) that the building was moved before 1939 to a private residence just outside of St. Michaels, where it sits today as a guest house.
