Last month on the 24th approximately 50 concerned Claiborne residents gathered for a community meeting at Maple Hall.

The meeting was conducted by Kirke Harper and lasted exactly one hour.

A report on the future of the Post Office and options that are available to us was presented.

The development of a Claiborne Community Association was discussed and met with great enthusiasm and will be pursued. A minimum of \$1 per person to join was met with a counter of \$5 being a more substantial amount in order to get things going.

We also heard from the Reverend John Moore from the Methodist Church regarding the use of the church's community room as a community center for the village. The church is considered "a limited use" property for religious services (the 5th Sunday of every month there will be a worship service held.)

Reverend Moore has granted us permission to have our monthly town meetings, an annual Christmas Potluck Gathering and our annual yard sale at the property, using both inside and outside areas.
