Quinta Do Alqueve Fernao Pires (\$12.)

Quinta Do Alqueve Tradicional (\$14)

Quinta Do Alqueve is located in the Ribatejo region of Portugal, approximately 40 miles north of Lisbon. They grow native Portuguese grapes such as the white Fernao Pires as well as other international varieties, and all fruit is picked by hand and hand-sorted before vinification. The Tradicional is a red blend of Touriga Nacional, Tinta Roriz, Trincadeira and Periquita that seems to go particularly well with roasted turkey.

Recommended wines are either in stock or available by order from your favorite local retailer.
