### Claiborne Strategic Planning Committee Report - Mary Gregorio

Hello Claiborne Neighbors and Friends, we hope you are well and that you are staying hydrated! In a recent tome dedicated to providing some information about the Claiborne Association and its origins, I noted a couple of themes: first that the Claiborne Association works to benefit residents of Claiborne and, second, that the work of the Association is done by your neighbors and friends. That theme underpins the work of the Strategic Planning Committee, an ad hoc committee formed by the Board, to create a sustainability plan for the Claiborne Association and for the care and maintenance of the Village Hall.

As the work of the Committee nears completion, what follows is a promised update. Since its inception in April, the Committee has:

- reviewed the Claiborne Association's mission, vision, and values;
- completed a SWOT analysis (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats);
- held three focus groups with invited participants;
- invited (82) residents to complete an online survey. Of the 82 invitations, we received 41 responses.

The following are summaries of what we learned. You'll note some differences of opinion that might form the basis for further discussion. An example: should we expand membership to a broader community. The question, though broad, gives us an opportunity to think more and talk more about how to enhance financial stability and participation. Ideally, we will have additional opportunities to talk through some of these questions.
