# **Claiborne Roads**

The Talbot County Roads crew replaced a damaged culvert in front of Bob Todd's house in April. The old galvanized culvert pipe had rusted through resulting in a dangerous hole next to the roadbed. Kirke Harper has been working with the Public Works Department and the Roads Supervisor on roads issues and to develop traffic calming ideas that will work for Claiborne. The failed culvert was one of the issues they discussed in late February. Other issues discussed include the broken culvert on Miracle House Circle between the Murphy's and the Flory's, and the need for a swale along the north side of Bay side Drive.

# <u> Traffic Calming – Part II</u>

Traffic Calming was one of the subjects raised at the April General Meeting of the Claiborne Association. The consensus expressed was to ask the County to: -Install a sign announcing the change in speed from 50 to 40 mph at Cockey Rd; -Install a sign warning drivers of the upcoming change in speed limit; -Install rumble strips on Claiborne Rd between Cockey Rd and Maple Hall Rd; -Install 25 mph speed signs on Claiborne Landing Rd;

-Change the stop signs at the intersection of Claiborne Landing Rd and Claiborne Rd so that traffic leaving the wharf has to stop before entering Claiborne Rd; -Install rumble strips on Claiborne Landing Rd.

For our part of the traffic calming effort, the Claiborne community will design and install a Welcome to Claiborne sign with trees and shrubs on the north side of Claiborne Rd, opposite the trees surrounding the Verizon switch box. We will plant a few street trees along Claiborne Rd starting at the village gateway before Maple Hall Road. One of the things we are trying to protect is the rural nature of the village without making it feel like a suburban place full of signs and warnings.
